We had a good summer camping season. Summer started with the Village Church hosting a Creation Arts Camp. It was a Day Camp and they made a different craft each day and they displayed them on Friday night to family, friends and residents of the Village.

It was exciting to have Children's International Summer Village (CISV) come right afterwards for 23 days. This was their first summer camp ever. They had previously come only for weekend retreats; the last time was in 2019. They had between 45-80 campers each week that came from eight different countries (USA, Brazil, Denmark, Finland, Greece, Israel, Latvia & Sweden).



Our Florida Conference Church Camps held their two weeks of camp, Senior Camp had 60 campers and Junior Camp had 58. Senior camp's theme was "Reboot" and Shane Mumford was the speaker and he also served as Co-Director along with Liz Vann. There were eight first time

campers at Senior Camp.

Junior camp's theme was "Hide & Seek", the key verse being Psalm 139:14. I was the Pastor and speaker and the Co-Directors were Jeannie Thomas and Jeff Pannone. There were 26 first time campers at Junior camp.

Looking forward, we have the Youth Retreat coming up in January, planned for January 13-15. Applications will be available on our website in November and mailed out the first of December.

Junior Camp Report

This Summer we had the opportunity to work at Camp Suwannee's Junior Camp. This was our first year helping, and overall, we really enjoyed it. There were several things that stood out to us at camp. Some significant memories were the evening services, Bowl services, and water time.

The Theme for camp this year was Hide and Seek. The foundational passage for this theme was Psalm 139. Every evening Mr. Mabey and Mr. Sincovich taught on this theme. Mr. Mabey taught that we cannot hide from Jesus; we cannot hide our thoughts or our feelings from him. He knows us and He wants us to know Him. Also, God is not hiding from us; He has already sought us out and is waiting for us to seek Him. Mr. Sincovich taught that we need to not hide from the truth or hide truth from others. This time at camp helped us to remember why we were there. It changed the places in our hearts that had become hard because of the business of everything.

Another of our favorite was water time. During this time the kids could go canoeing, tubing, or swimming. We liked this time because we got to put aside our leadership roles and be the kids' playmates and friends. We remember being kids and thinking it was fun when older people would play with us. It

was like our ages did not matter, and we could all be friends. Because of this, water time was something all of us enjoyed.

Ultimately, Camp Suwannee allowed us to see the body of Christ come together pouring Jesus into the lives of kids. We arrived hardly knowing any of the people and left being friends with all of them. After getting to camp, we learned that there were a lot of new people. Despite this, everyone got along. This is amazing! Being able to see the unity that strangers have when they are all connected to Christ is an awesome thing. We appreciate the heart of camp Suwannee. The directors were good to remind us that the purpose of camp was to focus on the kids and to lead them to Jesus.
